

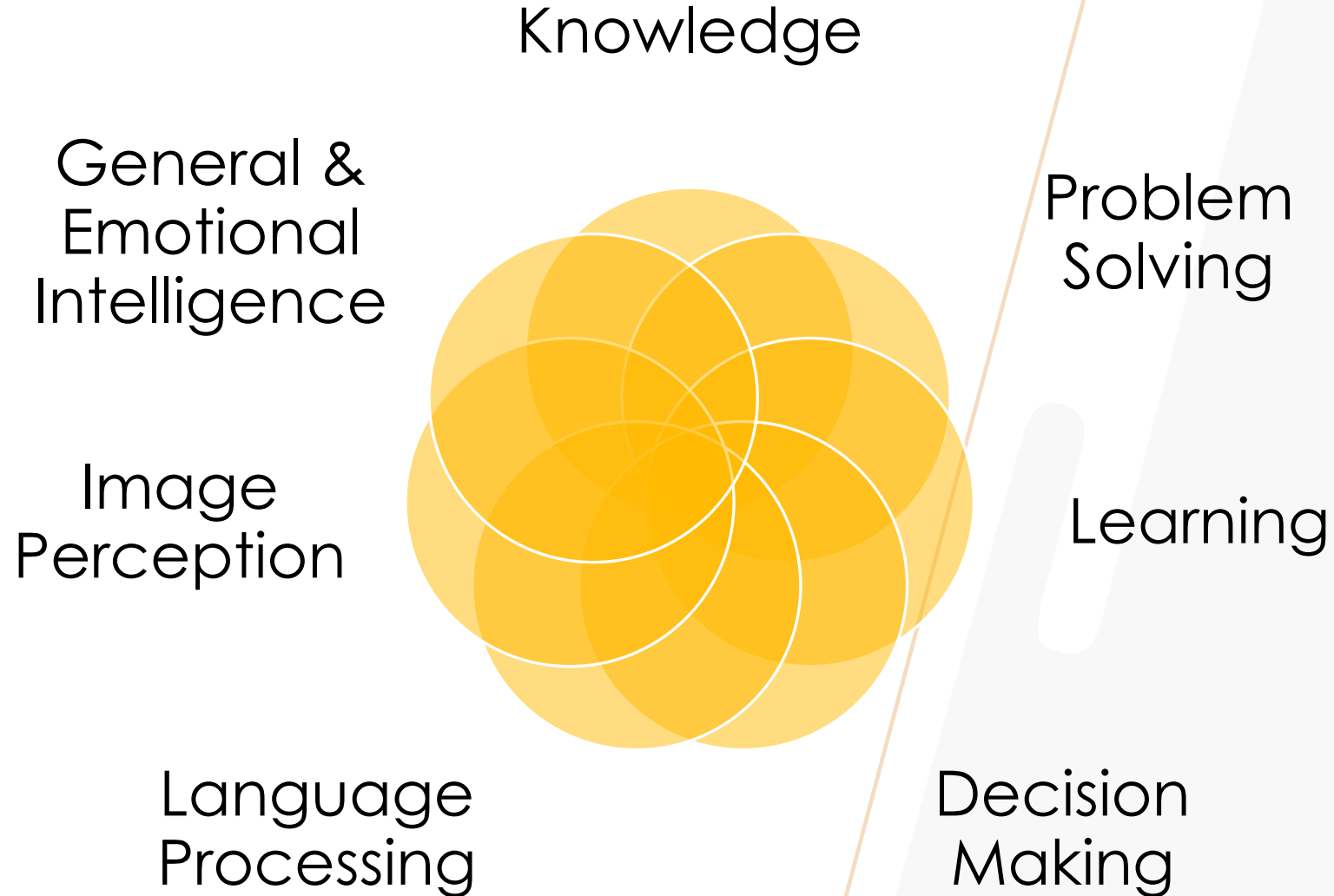

A.I. Emulates Human Intelligence



The Prevalence of A.I.

Traditional A.I.

- **Formulates predictions by analyzing historical information/data**
 - Search Engines
 - Stock market modeling
 - Consumer market trends
 - Weather forecasting

Generative A.I.

- **Uses existing data to “create” new content**
 - Netflix Recommendations
 - Siri/Alexa/Google
 - Virtual Customer Service
 - Instagram/Facebook
 - **ChatGPT, Bard**



So, why all the fuss re: ChatGPT?

- ChatGPT identifies patterns within data and **generates new content** from it's understanding of language, style, and context
- Generates content that **sounds human-like**
- Widespread applicability, **ease of use** (natural language processing)
- Increased **efficiency & productivity**
- **GPT** = Generative Pretrained Transformer

What can **ChatGPT** do?

- Prepare General Outlines
- Draft Letters, Agreements & Memos of Law
- Summarize Documents & Decisions
- Analyze and Revise Agreements/Provisions
- Prepare Questions for EBT, Trial, Hearing
- Legal Marketing & Social Media Plans



Getting Started with ChatGPT

- 1. “Sign up” for account: <https://chat.openai.com/auth/login>
- 2. Log in and type prompt into “Send a message” box.
- 3. Provide **CONTEXT & SPECIFICITY** in your prompt.
- 4. Input follow-up prompts to refine answers.
- 5. Chats are saved and can be resumed later.

Reviewing Decisions & Conducting **Legal Research**

SAMPLE PROMPTS

- Summarize the following in an executive summary and include key bullet points outlining all issues, analysis, and conclusions throughout: [insert decision].
- Provide me with an overview of the legal precedents in [area of law]. Please tell me what key cases exist in this area of law and what the key legal arguments were.
- Conduct legal research on [legal issue or topic]. Please be concise. Summarize the relevant case law, statutes, and regulations. Provide analysis and conclusions based on your research.



Drafting, Reviewing & Negotiating **Contracts**

SAMPLE PROMPTS

- Draft a [contract type] between [party 1] & [party 2] for [consideration] in [jurisdiction].
- Draft a letter/email to opposing counsel detailing the reasons why their [argument] is [flaw with argument].
- What should be included in a [contract type]?
- Summarize the following and include key bullet points outlining all issues, analysis, and conclusions throughout: [insert content to be summarized].
- Proofread the following: [insert content].
- Revise the following provision [include provision reference] to include the following: [insert change requested]

Drafting Questions for Depositions/Discovery/Trial

SAMPLE PROMPTS

- Generate a list of deposition questions for the [husband/wife], who is the [monied/non-monied spouse] in a divorce action. Please ensure the questions are clear and concise.
- You are preparing discovery interrogatories as the attorney for a divorce matter and you represent the [wife/husband]. Draft a comprehensive list of detailed interrogatory questions to better understand the finances including their lifestyle, assets and liabilities of the parties.
- **Followup Prompt:** Generate additional questions relating to [specify additional area of interest].



Drafting Emails & Marketing Content

SAMPLE PROMPTS

- Please draft an email to a client and explain [legal concept] in lay terms and analyze how this relates to the client's issue.
- **Followup Prompt:** Provide more detail regarding the following [legal issue/concept].
- Draft a courteous and professional response to the following negative online review that is brief and offers further dialogue to improve upon their experience: [paste review]
- **Followup Prompt:** Rewrite it using a more sympathetic tone



One Prompt to **Rule them All**

“You are a prompt generation robot. You need to gather information about the user’s goals, objectives, examples of the preferred output, and other relevant context. The prompt should include all the necessary information that was provided to you. Ask follow-up questions to the user until you have the confidence to produce a perfect prompt. Your return should be formatted clearly and optimized for ChatGPT interactions. Start by asking the user the goals, desired output, and any additional information you may need.”





Reminders for Writing Effective Prompts

- **GIVE CONTEXT**

give context and background regarding the assignment

- **ASSIGN A PERSONA**

assign a personality, tone, expertise; provide background detail

- **BE SPECIFIC**

Provide clear and specific instructions for what you want as the result

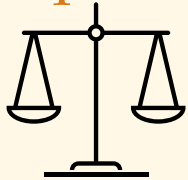
- **POLISH THE RESULTS**

Ask ChatGPT to elaborate, refine, verify, and evaluate its response

Veracity of the A.I.'s dataset-is it current?

What inherent biases may exist in the A.I.'s dataset?

Mata v. Avianca, Inc., 2023 US Dist. LEXIS 10823, 2023 WL 4114965 (2023): Attorneys sanctioned for citing case law fabricated by ChatGPT. Fed. R. Civ. P. Rule 11(b)(2) violation. **DON'T BE LIKE THEM!**

ChatGPT ≠ Lawyer

- **ChatGPT Response:** “Legal research, including case law and statutes, can be complex and jurisdiction-specific. To get precise and up-to-date information, **it's essential to consult primary legal sources such as statutes and court decisions directly...**
- **ChatGPT Response:** “**I don't have access to real-time legal databases or the ability to provide specific case citations.** As of my last update in September 2021, I can't provide you with the names or specific details of recent or specific legal cases.
- **ChatGPT Response:** “Remember, legal strategies and outcomes can vary significantly based on the specific facts of the case and the judge's discretion, so **it's crucial to have a knowledgeable attorney** who can present a compelling argument tailored to your situation.”
- Relax...currently, ChatGPT cannot emulate the emotional intelligence, decision making, and problem-solving skills necessary to practice matrimonial law.

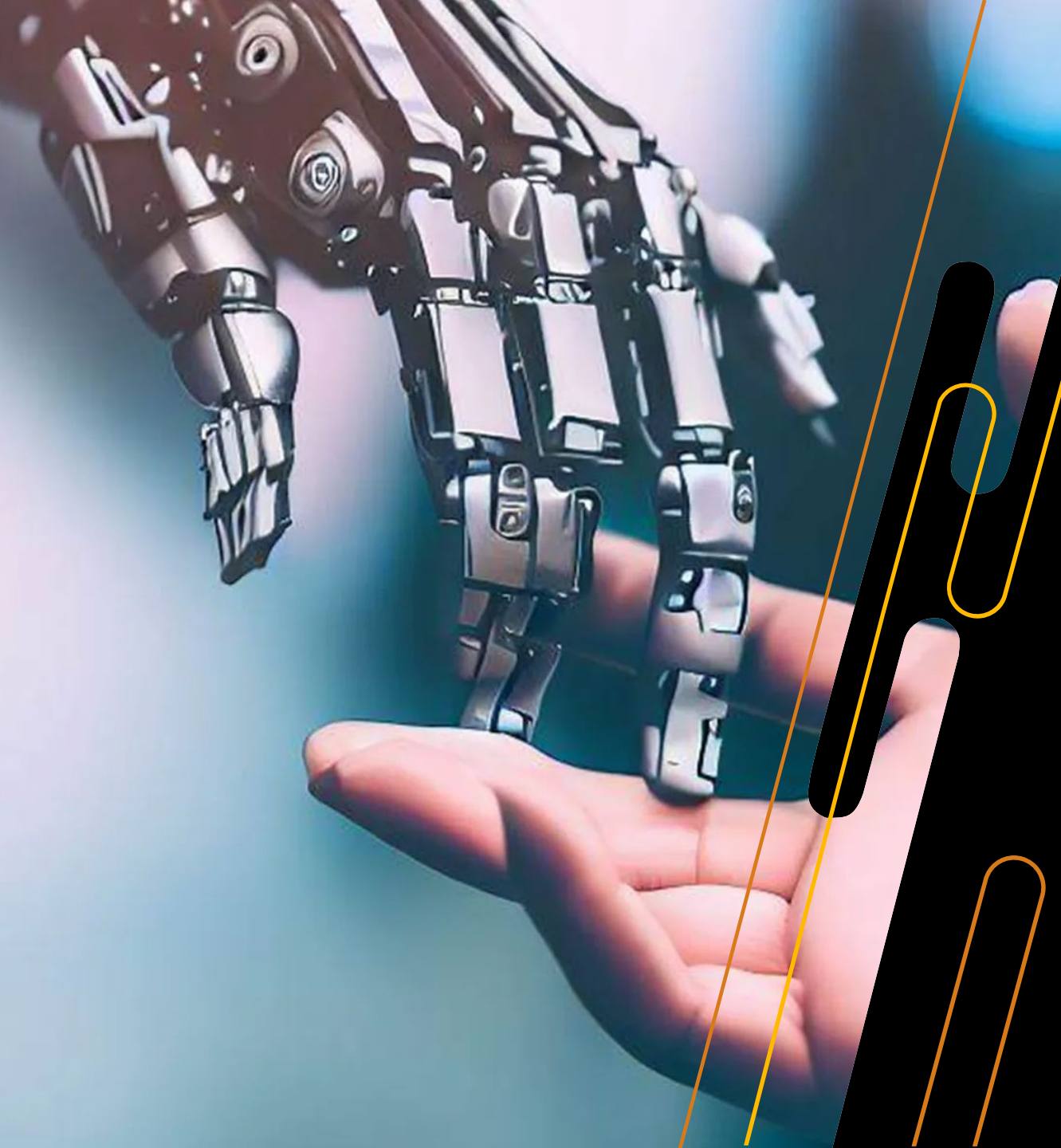
